

PRINTABLE KIDS ACTIVITY:

Families Around the World Matching Game



How to Play:

1. Cut out all cards (you can laminate them for durability).
2. Mix them up and lay them face down.
3. Kids take turns flipping over one description and one illustration.
4. If the cards match, they keep the pair. If not, flip back and try again.
5. The player with the most pairs at the end wins!

Description Cards

She lives with her parents, her aunt, uncle, and her grandparents. It's always busy and full of laughter.

Multigenerational Family

Same-Gender Parents

Single-Parent Family

She lives with her mom, dad, little brother and her grandparents. They all live together in the apartment.

Extended Family Household

She lives with her mom, dad, sister and baby brother. Her aunt and uncle live next door, and their families often celebrate holidays together.

Close-Knit Extended Family in Neighboring Homes

She is from Syria. She now lives in Germany with her brother and their guardian.

Non-Parental Guardian Family

He lives in the United States with his mom and stepdad. He has a stepsister who is the same age.

Blended Family

She lives with her mom's best friend. Even though they're not related by blood, she takes care of her.

Families with Non-Biological Guardians

He has two homes — one with her mom and one with her dad. He has a bedroom at each house and loves visiting both!

Co-Parenting Family
